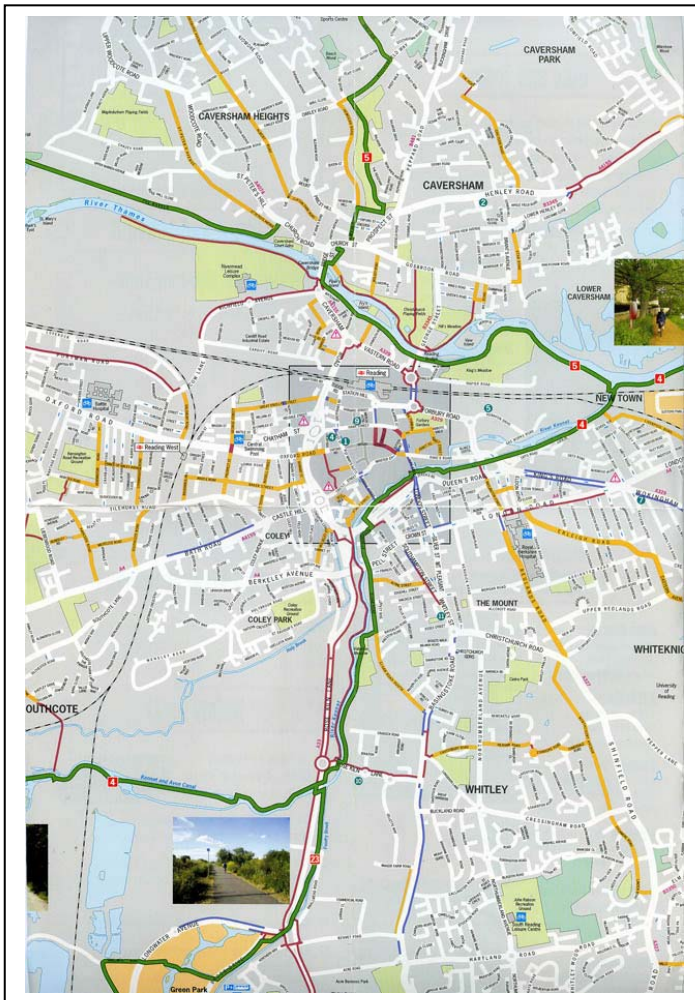

A treasure hunt is always fun because even if you do not find any treasure you will almost certainly return enriched with some information you didn't know before you started your journey.

Please take part to enjoy the challenge and the new vistas of Reading which will be revealed.

Email or post us the answers to these 6 questions for your chance to win prizes.

You do not have to follow the suggested route to find the answers, but if you start in Reading Town Centre, a visit to the Visitor Centre to collect a 'Cycling in Reading' map would be a useful addition to your bike to attempt this quest. A map is also available to download from: www.readingcyclecampaign.org.uk

Reading has three National Cycle Network Routes: Nos 4, 5 and 23. The questions involve exploring all of these.

Make haste to the Reading Museum to find out the vintage of the bicycle displayed (NOTE: museum open Tue-Sat 10-4; Sun 11-4; Cycling in Reading Map should also be in stock)

Q1) What year does the bicycle date from?

You now have to explore north over the Thames. Take National Cycle Network (NCN) Route 5 to Reading's highest park (pewh!) and enjoy the view to the south. What you can see beyond the 20th Century office blocks is Reading's 21st Century landmark.

Q2) What is it?

Return down NCN 5 to the major junction of Reading's famous rivers, very historic but named New Town! This is also the junction of two NCN routes, find the NCN Millennium milepost.

Q3) What are the four places signposted on this milepost?

Now pedal west on NCN 4. It takes you through 'The Oracle'.

Q4) How far is it from here to Wargrave?

Now southwards along NCN 4 to a water meadow named after a famous battle. Here you will find some stone architecture by a playground on the National Cycle Route.

Q5) What is it?

Continue south and 'slalom' over the River Kennet to join NCN 23. Head to the home of the 'Royals'. Windsor does not beckon but the home of our local sporting heroes. They have a 'Mega-store'.
